Dr. Allegretti received a B.A. in Biology and English from LaSalle University in Philadelphia and was a recipient of the President's Scholarship at the University, along with the Most Valuable Player on the Rugby team in his senior year. He remained in Philadelphia for his medical school training at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine where he received the Board of Trustees Scholarship.
